Village Neighbors is Dementia Friendly!

DEMENTIA FRIEND INFO SESSION

Tuesday, June 13, 6:30 at the Wendell Senior Center or Zoom

As we journey through aging in place in our four towns, we are aware of the special challenges faced by those with dementia and their caregivers. Greatest among these may be gradually increasing isolation and a need for caregiver support and respite. Village Neighbors (VN) can offer inclusion and support for those of us experiencing these challenges, as many do and will. Some volunteers are already gaining great satisfaction by taking someone with dementia for a walk or spending time with a member so their caregiver can have a needed break

Dementia Friendly Massachusetts tells us that there are now 150,000 folks in Massachusetts living with dementia, which will grow to 250 000 by 2030. They state, "By working together, we can make great strides in supporting individuals living with dementia, as well as their friends and families. A 'dementia friendly' community is informed, safe and respectful, and enables people living with dementia and those who care about them to live full, engaged lives".

VN can help increase the level of information and awareness within our communities, as well as increase our skills in communicating and engaging with those with dementia. All members and volunteers are encouraged to attend one of our one hour Dementia Friend Info Sessions to gain some basic awareness of normal aging vs dementia, tips on communication with folks having language and memory difficulties, and come away with five key messages that lead to improved quality of life for those affected. We can encourage our towns to adopt this awareness, and we can all learn how to reach out to other community resources.

Our next **Dementia Friend Info Session** is planned for **Tuesday June 13 at 6:30** in person at the Wendell Senior Center at the town center, or can be attended by zoom.
