

### **An Increasing Need in Our Village**

35-40% of the population in all four of the Village Neighbors' towns are age 60 and over. An ever greater fraction of those are now age 75 and older.

There are more households coping with various levels of memory loss and dementia. While not "normal" in aging, the incidence is greater the longer we live. As **Dementia Friendly Communities**, we want to offer support and acceptance to our neighbors facing such challenges. How can we as individuals help with this, as an organization whose mission is to help each other age safely in our homes?

Increasing our knowledge is a great first step! Take some time to learn a little more about dementia- what it is and isn't, how to more skillfully interact with someone who has memory or language loss, what each of us might offer to support a caregiver. If you haven't already done so, please attend a Dementia Friend Info Session to gain a basic understanding. All are welcome! Take part in a live or zoom session to learn how to best communicate with someone with language loss due to dementia, and some activity suggestions.

The next **Dementia Friends Info Session** will take place on **Tuesday January 23** from **6:30 to 7:30pm** in hybrid format at the **Wendell Senior Center** or by **zoom**. # Village Neighbors Promotes Age Friendly Communities!

Since opening in October of 2018 as the first in Franklin County to organize under the Village to Village model, Village Neighbors (VN) has been building capacity to serve our mission as "caring neighbors helping aging adults lead independent and engaged lives at home".

With over 1/3 of our 4 towns being over 60 years old, many with low incomes, and many living in isolated homes; and infrastructure challenges such as little public transportation, inadequate access to inhome care and other elder services, we find strength in a growing collaboration among our 4 towns and in Franklin County.

Age Friendly Communities is a network established by the World Health Organization in 2010 to encourage local communities to take actions that foster healthy and active aging. In the US, the American Association of Retired People (AARP) oversees Age Friendly States and Communities under the Liveable Communities program. You are encouraged to check the website AARP.org/Livable to see how states, and towns large and small are inspired to create community projects that make a difference.

The Franklin County/ North Quabbin initiative, led by LifePath, our area agency on aging, and the Franklin County Regional Council of Governments (FRCOG) obtained a 3 year grant from Massachusetts in 2020 -2023. VN has met with officials in all 4 towns to urge joining as Age Friendly Communities and has been building relationships with our town's Councils On Aging as well as taking part in the creation of a Regional Action Plan for 2024-2028 for our area. This plan, a collaborative effort

by many, was presented in November of 2023 at a community event in Greenfield. valuable form of support provided by **LifePath** directly to unpaid caregivers who provide assistance to support individuals to remain in their homes. The caregivers might be caring for a person with a

developmental disability, dementia, or complex medical conditions.

Caregivers may also be grandparents caring for grandchildren. The scholarships aim to alleviate the pressures experienced by caregivers and simultaneously enhance the quality of care provided to the recipient.

# Franklin Regional Transit Authority (FRTA) Available Programs For Wendell, New Salem, and Shutesbury

New Salem and Wendell local transportation for seniors

### **Demand Response**

This senior transportation program is a curb-to-curb service using fully accessible vehicles for anyone that is 60 years or older.

& Sunday from 9:30am-5:30pm. Fares range from \$1.75-\$2.75 each way. Our fleet vehicles for the Demand Response program are fully accessible.

New Salem, Shutesbury, and Wendell long distance medical transportation for seniors

### MedRide

A volunteer transportation program that is specifically for residents of FRTA member towns in Franklin County that have long distance medical appointments outside of Franklin County. This is open to **New Salem**, **Shutesbury**, **and Wendell** and we charge a per-mile fee of \$0.40. These are volunteer drivers using their own personal vehicles to transport, so

riders must be ambulatory.
