Medicare Savings Program Expands to Benefit 40,000 More Individuals

According to a Press Release from the Governor's Office, 40,000 more Medicare Beneficiaries across the state of Massachusetts will be eligible for the Medicare Savings Program. Starting January 1, 2020 income eligibility expanded for the MSP program from 135% to 165% of the Federal Poverty Level, and the asset limit doubled.

This is GREAT news for those who are newly eligible! It will increase the quality of life for many by directly increasing their income and adding significant benefits towards medications.

If you qualify, these programs will pay your monthly Part B premium (\$144.60) and in some cases your Part A and B deductibles, co-pays and Part A premium (if you have one).

Taking Charge of Your Future: Know the Benefits of Palliative Care and Hospice

Most of us are familiar with Hospice Care and how important it is to help families negotiate end of life care. Most of us are less familiar with Palliative Care, a newer concept in care that also has many similar benefits and guidance.

Angela Russek, ANP-BC, Palliative Care Nurse Practitioner with Hospice of Franklin County will speak about Palliative Care, how it differs from Hospice Care, and how and when to access these services. Angel can guide us through their differing philosophies and help determine which can help in a particular case. Both share a philosophy of person-centered care, and listen to the preferences of the people they serve.

Village members and volunteers are encouraged to attend even if you don't expect to need such services in the near future. This information may suddenly become needed by any of us in the community, and this basic overview will give us knowledge of what help is available for ourselves and our neighbors.

There once was a Wendell resident who felt completely overwhelmed with the prospect of establishing order in her filing cabinet. As an application deadline fast approached, she couldn't locate the paperwork needed to accompany it.

"My need was strong enough to push me to reach out to Village Neighbors for assistance," Ilina, a Village Neighbors member, stated in a recent kitchen table interview.

Soon after she made her request for assistance, a VN volunteer from Shutesbury, Dina P., made a series of three home visits. The first visit they organized the piles of paper and began going though the file cabinet for the paper work she needed. They weeded the files as they worked through, but did not find all the paperwork. The second, quicker visit, they set up her answering machine, which she needed. By the third visit, they got the application paperwork together, copied and re-filed.

Ilina went on to say that she now has an organized system in place that allows her to find what she needs with ease.

"As a writer, I want to publish, and I needed to get organized. Dina was a huge help. We tore through the filing cabinet! Village Neighbors is an amazing resource, to line up help in this way. I love that this agency has as its mission to help each other. I love living in a village!"

When asked why she volunteers for Village Neighbors, Dina replied, "Community is really important to me. What is simple for me to do, may be hard for someone else. The goal is that we get to know each other, to share information and skills. This way the access point for help is through our neighbor rather than through formal systems."

I wondered how the experience of volunteering with Ilina was for Dina. "It was great!" she replied enthusiastically. "It made me go home and clean out my own filing cabinet. I got to meet a fabulous poet and help someone who needed it!"
