VN Small Home Repairs Project 2020

Volunteer Russ Greco - VN Small Repairs Team:

In early September Glenn Stockton, Bert Fernandez and I were invited to help organize a Small Repairs Team under the auspices of Village Neighbors for the purpose of helping people age in place at home. Paul Lyons and Sam Rogers eventually joined us.

What we all had in common was a love of working with our hands, some good experience in residential construction, gratitude for everything we have in life and a desire to give back to our community at this stage in our lives. United in our commitment to service work, and happy to take money out of the equation, this endeavor has so far not only been rewarding but fun as well.

Our focus has been on assessing and completing small jobs (less than a couple of days and a couple of hundred dollars in materials) that address not only safety issues but general maintenance as well. We've worked by committee (online) to put the organizational structure together keeping things as simple as possible while, at the same time, making sure everything is documented for grant purposes. Having such a competent group and receiving strong support from our admin liaisons, **Elizabeth Fernandez O'Brien** and **Don Stone** has made it very manageable.

Some of the work accomplished includes: installation of grab bars, railings and exterior steps, door refitting, door hardware repair and replacement, gutters cleaned and repaired, smoke alarms replaced, light bulbs changed, winterization projects, deck repair, small plumbing and electrical repair, furniture repair and mailbox replacement. I'd like to thank all of you who took extra time to write really kind thank you notes to our team. It meant a lot to us! I might add, also, that we have had no problems related to CoVid-19 protocol.

Given our efficiency so far I would expect that we would be able to serve another 25 households in addition to the 25 we are already committed to complete. This first group should be finished by the New Year. We are helped in this goal by the donations that we hope to receive from satisfied clients. Unlike some programs we are not limited to helping only those who are in financial need. One only need be a Village Neighbors member. For that reason, we have invited those who can afford it to think about making a donation if they are satisfied with the work done. This stretches our grant money (for materials) and allows us to serve a greater population.

To all of you who we have helped so far: thank you for your gratitude! We are getting as much out of it as you seem to be.

April

Creation of the **Pandemic Response Team**, establishing safety protocols for volunteers and members so we could continue grocery and medicine pick-ups and delivery. Research and distribute CoVid resources and information. Calls to every member – list of weekly check-ins. Email and website updates with CoVid resources. Membership Renewal mailing. VN organized a Zoom meeting with the local **Councils on Aging** to solidify our collaboration through the crisis.

The Finance Committee secured a **Health New England COVID Relief Grant** to provide Pandemic Relief Gift Bags to all our members. The Gift Bags contained masks, sanitizer, soap, tea and other items of use and good cheer. All heartfully prepared and delivered by our volunteers.

June

Village Neighbors Annual Meeting was conducted on Zoom. Elections were held for 2 new board members – Miriam DeFant and Dina Polizzi, and VN Secretary Mary-Anne Palmieri returning for another term. Committees delivered their annual reports and there was time for questions from the membership.

July-August

Volunteers continued with grocery and medicine pick-up and delivery to members, maintaining social distancing

protocols. Yard work and outdoor repairs calls were also handled with social distance.

Surveys were sent to all members asking what events and activities they would be interested in.

Call Managers (CM) are the front line people for VN.
