Age-Friendly Survey

Completed Survey Must Be Received by March 11th

The Age-Friendly Communities Initiative is launching a regional survey in Franklin County and the North Quabbin. The initiative is a collaboration led by LlfePath with FRCOG and participating Councils on Aging and Senior Centers. Through this survey, we are trying to understand what needs to improve for our region to become a great place for people to grow older. The information collected through this process will be used to create an Age-Friendly Action Plan and to apply for grants to improve conditions for older people in our towns.

If you live in New Salem, Shutesbury or Wendell, *Village Neighbors will be mailing a copy of this survey to your home.* Please complete it and mail back in the **self-addressed stamped envelope** before **March 11th**.

Leverett members can pick up a copy of the survey at the Leverett Town Hall, Leverett Library or the Village Co-op and return the completed survey to the same locations. Or you can call Margie McGinnis, Leverett town administrator, 413-548-9699 and she can mail you a copy.

The time you invest in completing this will make a difference in the programs and services available to everyone over 60 in our four towns.

The **Shutesbury Police Department** has started a program called "Sand for Seniors." The **Council on Aging** is assisting in the endeavor to reach Shutesbury seniors and make sure their needs are met during these icy times. Buckets have been generously donated by the **Hadley Home Depot**. If you are a resident of Shutesbury and senior (or someone with a disability or just someone in need) contact the Shutesbury Police Department by phone **413-259-1279** and leave a message with your name and phone number. Please state in your message that you are calling in regards to the "**Sand for Seniors program**." An Officer will call you back and get your information and deliver the Sand to your doorstep. At the end of the season, we will collect the buckets and store them for next year.

I am asking anyone that knows a Senior neighbor who may appreciate the help to also give them this message as some of our Seniors do not receive town announcements.

We can not wait to connect with our Seniors and anyone who just needs a little extra help.

We have a starting number of 40 donated buckets.

Beneficiary Protections when Choosing Your Medicare Coverage

The **Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment** season runs from January 1st to **March 31st** each year. If you are already enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan anytime between January 1st and March 31st of 2022, you are allowed to make a change to a new Medicare Advantage plan OR to drop your Medicare Advantage plan and switch to a stand-alone Medicare Part D prescription drug plan.

During this period, you may see a number of advertisements and marketing efforts highlighting the benefits that many of these plans offer. In fact, Massachusetts has several new plans being offered to Medicare beneficiaries in 2022. While many of these plans offer good coverage and many new benefits, it's extremely important that Medicare beneficiaries know the right questions to ask before making any changes to their current coverage. Remember:

- You should ask for confirmation that all of your doctors/medical providers accept any plan BEFORE you enroll.
- You should also ask for confirmation that all of your current prescription medications are covered by any plan(s) you are offered BEFORE you enroll.
- You should ask for confirmation that your hospital(s) of choice accept the plan you are considering BEFORE you enroll.
- You have the right to turn down any solicitations for Medicare enrollment information whether in person at your home or over the phone from individuals you do not know.
- You have the right to refuse to give your personal/Medicare information to anyone who asks if you are not sure of your decision to purchase insurance
- You are not obligated to provide the names of friends or family who may

also be seeking Medicare enrollment assistance.

• You have the right to report any misleading marketing practices to the Massachusetts Senior Medicare Patrol at 800-892-0890

Certified SHINE counselors are available at Councils on Aging and ASAPs across the state, and are able to assist you in making the right Medicare coverage decisions for your personal situation. This service is free and available year-round. SHINE counselors will make sure you are able to *compare ALL of the insurance options available to you, not just a select few.* Counselors are available in person, by phone, or for a virtual appointment on the web, whichever you prefer. We encourage you to call Mass Options at **1-800-243-4636** to find a SHINE counselor near you.

Triad FREE Medical Equipment for Seniors

The TRIAD Program of the Franklin County Sheriff's Office is a crimeprevention and wellness initiative aimed at protecting the safety and welfare of senior citizens throughout the county.

Medical Equipment Loan Program - In an effort to keep people in their homes as long as they can safely live there, **TRIAD provides/delivers** donated medical equipment such as wheelchairs, hospital beds, commodes, canes, walkers and rollators. *All equipment is free of charge.* Call 1-413-774-4726 for more information.
